

WKBC WILL GIVE CLOSING PROGRAM

Finis will be written on WKBC, "the little station on Fountain Heights," Wednesday night, when it will put its farewell program on the air and then sign off permanently.

H. L. Ansley, who has operated the station since June, 1926, "just for fun because its a hobby," announced the sale of his station Wednesday. He said the broadcasting plant, operating on 10 watts, 1,310 kilocycles, and 228.8 meters, had been purchased by a commercial house who would operate it to advertise. A permit to enlarge the station to 100 watts has been granted the new owners and they will go on the air in about 30 days, he said.

Alabama has four other broadcasting stations: WAPI, operating on 5,000 watts; WBRC, 500 watts; WJBY, Gadsden, 50 watts, and WIBZ, Montgomery, 20 watts.
