We had a distinguished visitor on the second Saturday when "Wimp" Sanderson brought his Zenith Transoceanic for us to repair.

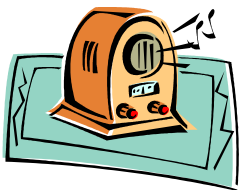
