A NOTE FROM THE PREZ

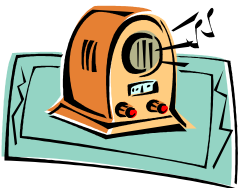
The weather seems to be cooling down a bit, so maybe everyone will be getting back in the mood for classes and fixing radios.
